Garden State Chapter Celebrates Its 31st Symposium

Once again, the Garden State SOLE Symposium, held at the Eatontown Sheraton on May 12, 2009, was a huge success. It was attended by over 300 people many of whom were CECOM LRC interns. This year our Keynote Speaker, Randy Fowler, the Assistant Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Materiel Readiness, spoke about the growing role logistics is playing in the defense arena and how it should be considered from a life-cycle perspective. He as well as Dave Floyd, from the Defense Acquisition University also addressed career opportunities and challenges for the life-cycle logistician.

Danny Jordan and Bob Mansfield from the Log.Sec Corp, a CSC Company, briefed how the AN/GRM-122 Test Set has emerged from a single radio tester to a multiple radio tester through the addition of Radio Personality Modules. The test set was demonstrated in the exhibit area and attendees were encouraged to try it out.

Mike Dazio from Datatek Applications gave a non-DoD point of view of product development and commercial versus military life cycles. He referenced some specific ways product life cycles can be extended through hardware and software upgrades and creative innovation and partnerships. His message, delivered passionately, included empowering people, thinking “out of the box”, rethinking life-cycle management, being creative and proactive, getting results and by all means having fun.

Dave Floyd CPL, DAU, spoke of “Implementing a Life-Cycle Management Framework.” He pointed to

a lack of robust Systems Engineering processes and poor reliability, availability and maintainability skills (RAM) as part of a significant DoD problem. He pointed to DoD Initiatives and Policy and the Restructured Life Cycle Phases detailed in the recent DoD 5000.02 as positives toward thinking in life-cycle management terms. Particularly noteworthy he said was the integration of Sustainment Metrics KPP/KSA into Requirements and the Notional Life Cycle Sustainment Plan (LCSP).

Michael Bogner, CECOM, talked directly to the intern population and gave them a variety of insights, suggestions and direction that will not only enhance their careers but lead to a more productive and healthy life. He amusingly talked about an audience “Bill of Rights” which included “No speaker will say, ‘I’ll talk about that later’” and “Any speaker who reads the whole slide verbatim will be gonged.” His ideas on health, reading lists and Spoken Mathematics were in the “Timeless Truths” category.

Ken Beam from the Logistics Innovation Agency (LIA) previously worked as an Electronics Engineer for the Communications Electronics Research, Development, and Engineering Center's Command and Control Directorate. He explained how LIA meets its mission to “Provide Innovative Capabilities and Solutions for Logistics Readiness”. He said LIA was like a Research, Development and Engineering activity for major logistics innovations from semi-autonomous robotics to 3D virtual environments.

Mike Egan, an AMC Fellows graduate, completed some of his on-the-job training rotations at Fort Monmouth (CECOM – LRC). He described the Army Logistics Enterprise vision as information superiority through real-time visibility of personnel, equipment, and supplies anywhere in the distribution pipeline and within the operational environment. This, he said, requires a seamless, integrated, end-to-end network delivered in a Single Army Logistics Enterprise (SALE). Implementing the SALE will require a merger of Warfighter and Business systems into a single, harmonious environment from the manufacturer to the foxhole and aligned with joint requirements.

Robert Lamanna who recently accepted a position as the Associate Industrial Base Advocate with the CECOM LRC talked to Sustainment Readiness: Embracing Outcomes and Enabling the Practitioner.

In working with key personnel at CECOM Logistics Readiness Center they have established an Industrial Base Strategic Plan greatly optimizing Life Cycle Management support to our PMs and warfighters. This key development has significant implications to Army Team C4ISR and at the OSD level.

Greetings and Happy Memorial Day! As some of you may know, I have been in school at Austin, TX for the past month. We will be holding our first Distinguished Logistician (DL) workshop, in late June/early July, at CSC, Computer Sciences Corporation, located at 15 Christopher Way, Eatontown, NJ 07724. The objective of this event is to help young logisticians review their credentials, determine if they are eligible for some variation of the DL certification, and help them fill out the appropriate paperwork. When it does take place (date TBD), the intent is to begin with a luncheon at 11:30, when Sarah James, the Executive Director from SOLE HQ, will give our members a presentation on the background and requirements of earning the DL Certification. She will then work with people individually, for an hour each, reviewing their documentation and submitting their application. There is no cost for this workshop and the Chapter will cover the cost of submitting the application for each SOLE member who puts forth the effort of doing the paperwork.

In addition, although we do not have a finalized start date for the delayed Certified Master Logistician (CML) prep course as of yet, Mr. Ken East is in the final planning stages and expects to have things prepared by next month. Our ultimate goal is to develop a curriculum that can be supported by the LRC, will fully prepare students for taking the exam, and can be executed with the necessary resources. We are steadily working towards making this a quality event and appreciate your patience as we finish taking the necessary steps to make this happen.

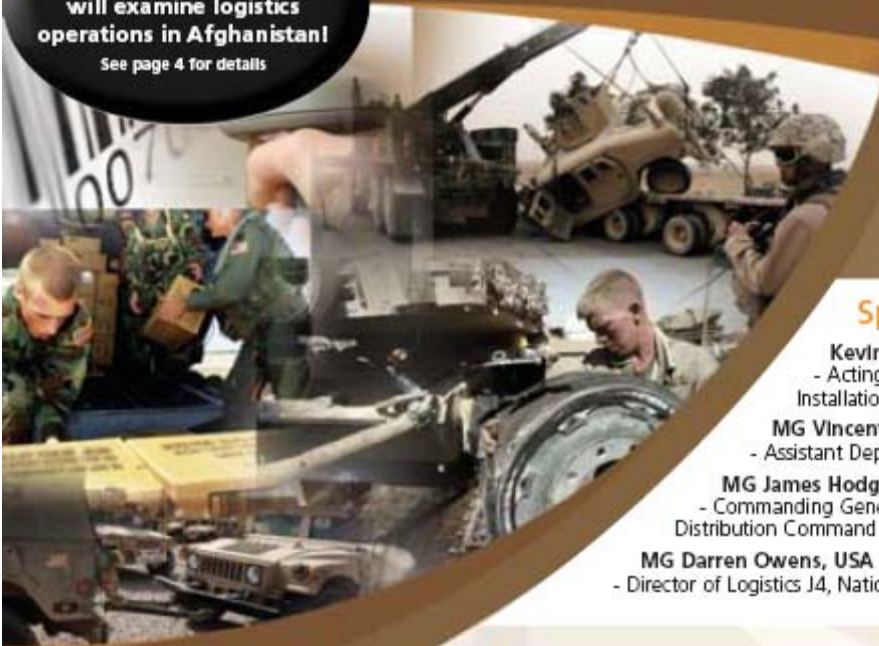

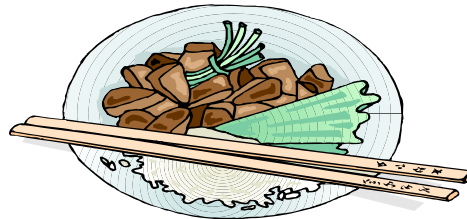
